DAY-WISE ITINERARY	
Day 00	Arrival in Guwahati Uiam Lake Onward to Shillong Touch down at Guwahati's Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport (or arrive by train), where your driver will be waiting to begin your Meghalaya story. The drive to Shillong is an introduction in itself — rolling hills, betel-nut groves, and the gradual cooling of the air as the road climbs into Meghalaya, often nicknamed the 'Scotland of the East' for its rolling green landscapes and misty climate. En route, pause at Uiam Lake (Barapani) — the largest man-made reservoir in Northeast India — where the still water perfectly mirrors the surrounding pine-clad hills. A short walk along the banks is the perfect way to shake off travel fatigue. Arrive in Shillong and check into your hotel. As evening sets in, wander through the city's lively local markets — a sensory introduction to Khasi culture, street food, and the unmistakable hill-station charm that gives Shillong its character. Settle in for a restful night, with the adventures of Meghalaya's most dramatic landscapes waiting just a day away. Stay: Shillong
Day 01	Shillong to Cherrapunji Nohkalikai Falls Mawmai & Arwah Caves After breakfast, set off on the scenic two-hour drive to Cherrapunji — one of the wettest places on Earth and a landscape sculpted entirely by monsoon rains. The first showstopper is Nohkalikai Falls, among the tallest waterfalls in India, plunging over 1,100 feet into a plunge pool that turns a striking shade of green in clear weather. The viewpoint here offers one of the most dramatic vistas in the entire Northeast. Next, descend into Mawmai Cave — a network of limestone passages lit just enough to reveal stalactites, stalagmites, and chambers that feel like a different planet altogether. Nearby, Arwah Cave reveals ancient marine fossils embedded in its rock walls, a reminder that this land was once underwater. Spend the late afternoon wandering Cherrapunji's town markets, where local produce, Khasi handicrafts, and the unhurried pace of hill life offer a gentle contrast to the day's adventures. Check into your hotel for a comfortable overnight stay, recharging for tomorrow's signature experience — the living root bridges.

Day 02	After breakfast, set off on the scenic two-hour drive to Cherrapunji — one of the wettest places on Earth and a landscape sculpted entirely by monsoon rains. Today is dedicated to Meghalaya's most extraordinary feat of living engineering — the Double Decker Living Root Bridge, a structure grown over generations by the Khasi tribes by training the roots of rubber trees across a river gorge. Walking across it feels like stepping into a living, breathing piece of folklore. For the adventurous, an optional trek descends through dense rainforest and over countless stone steps toward Rainbow Falls — a cascading waterfall framed by natural pools so clear that rainbows form in the spray on sunny days. Later, drive to Lyngksiar Waterfalls, a quieter, less-visited cascade where the sound of falling water and the surrounding forest canopy create a deeply calming atmosphere — perfect for unwinding after the morning's trek. Return to Cherrapunji as the afternoon mist rolls in, and spend the evening at leisure soaking in the serenity of this cloud-wrapped plateau. Overnight stay in Cherrapunji, with memories of root bridges and waterfalls still fresh. Stay: Cherrapunji Meals: Breakfast
Day 03	Drive to Dawki Umngot River Shnongpdeng Village India-Bangladesh Border After breakfast, begin the journey toward Dawki, a border town that has become legendary for one thing above all else: water so clear it seems to defy reality. The Umngot River at Dawki is famously transparent — boats appear to float in mid-air above the riverbed, and the turquoise water against green hills creates one of the most photographed scenes in all of Northeast India. On the way, stop at the tranquil Shnongpdeng village, a riverside hamlet known for its peaceful campsites, gentle breezes, and uninterrupted views of the Umngot — a favourite spot for travellers wanting to slow down completely. Spend time near the India-Bangladesh border, where the landscape shifts subtly and the sense of being at the edge of the map is hard to ignore. Check into your riverside camp for the night, enjoy a hearty dinner under the stars, and let the gentle sound of the river send you to sleep. Stay: Dawki (River-side Camps) Meals: Breakfast
Day 04	Dawki to Shillong Elephant Falls Phe Phe Falls Don Bosco Museum Wake to the calm of Dawki's riverside camp, enjoy breakfast, and begin the drive back toward Shillong. The route is dotted with waterfalls, the first being Elephant Falls — a three-tiered cascade named for a rock formation that once resembled an elephant (since eroded away, but the name and the beauty remain). Continue to Phe Phe Waterfall, a hidden gem surrounded by rich biodiversity — keep an eye out for unusual plant species and the occasional glimpse of local wildlife along the forested trail. Back in Shillong, immerse yourself in Northeast India's cultural heritage at the Don Bosco Centre for Indigenous Cultures, a striking museum showcasing the traditions of the seven sister states, followed by a visit to the nearby Cathedral, an architectural landmark in its own right. Settle into your hotel for the final overnight stay, reflecting on a journey through clouds, caves, rivers, and roots. Stay: Shillong Meals: Breakfast

Day 05	Departure Day Transfer to Guwahati
	Enjoy a relaxed final breakfast in Shillong, taking in the hill-station views one last time.
	Depart for Guwahati, where your trip concludes at Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport or the Railway Station.
	Carry home memories of waterfalls that defy scale, rivers that defy belief, and bridges that grow rather than get built — Meghalaya has a way of staying with you long after you've left.
